Turn round at Hardwick Hall main entrance and return by the same route to finish at Pilsley School. There are two cattle grids and many hills. Pilsley is situated near Chesterfield and Clay Cross. Alfreton for M1 South and Heath for M1 North. Race numbers are not sent by post. You collect them on the race day at Pilsley School, changing rooms in Pilsley School, Sports Hall.
